USF Police Department partners wiffDOT District Seven for safer roads

Tampa/Hillsborough County, FŁIn a significant move to enhance road safety, the USF Police Department is teaming up with the Florida Department Transportation (FDOT) District Seven through an Enhanced Law Enforcement Engager(EnEE) program. This partnership, effective from July 1, 2024, to March 31, 2025, will see not reasonable asset first responder presence on state roadways with high crash rates, thereby rais included awareness about the importance of safe driving.

Our efforts will be concentrated oney areas identified in the Stathighway Strategic Safety Plan (SHSSP), including intersection violations; dgivinder the influence (DUI); speeding, aggressive, and distracted driving; lane departure, working violations; and move over violations.

"FDOT District Seven is committed to making our roads safer through partnerships with local first responders," said FDOT District Engineer Emmeth Druna.E. "Through this program, we are working to reach FDOT's targetefo fatal crashes and serious injuries."

"We are proud to partner with FDOT on this initivatito increase the safety of our roadways for all motorists," said USF Police Chief Chris Daniel. "We all share a common interest in the importance of safe driving, not just around USF's campuses but throughout the Tampa Bay region and our state."
